

Scholarship Application

Dear Student:

The members of Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association are pleased to announce our plans to award multiple scholarships to qualified applicants who are either working for, or have family members working with, our regional industry.

As the cost of college education continues to increase, obtaining an advanced education is becoming harder to achieve. Our scholarship program is dedicated to helping top students reach their academic potential and career goals, while responding to the financial pressures placed on their families.

To qualify for this award, applicants must be high school seniors, college freshmen and/or sophomores, who have either been accepted, or are currently enrolled in a 2- or 4-year accredited college or university, and connected with our grain and feed Direct membership in some way. Previous recipients of the PNWGFA Scholarship are not eligible to apply again. The deadline for applying for these awards is April 6, 2023, so act now!

REMINDER In recent years, the Board added the PNWGFA Ag Leader Scholarship, which is awarded to deserving candidates actively pursuing education and a career in an agricultural field. Other scholarships in various fields will also be considered.

Applications must be postmarked no later than April 6, 2023.

The 2023 scholarship application is currently in a PDF fillable format. We hope to publish an online version on www.pnwgfa.org in the future. The onus falls upon the student to ensure <u>all</u> required sections are correctly submitted and received by PNWGFA prior to the stated deadline. Partial applications will not be considered.

The recipients of the Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association Scholarship grants will be notified by the end of May 2023 (via phone and/or email). Special recognition to the membership will be given at the Annual Convention June 15, in McCall, Idaho. Recipients are welcome, but not required, to attend this event.

Instructions:

Following these five steps will improve your chances of being selected as a scholarship recipient:

- 1. Type or print the application.
- 2. Complete and return application as soon as possible. The application deadline is April 6, 2023.
- 3. Scholarship awards are based on the applicant's GPA, Work Experience and Leadership Qualities, and Applicant's Statement, with a possible total of 100 points. Failure to complete one or more sections of the application will likely disqualify your application. (*See Eligibility and Application Procedure sections below.)
- 4. Use the space provided, and be as concise as possible. Within reason, additional information may be included on supplemental sheets.
- 5. Recipients of the scholarship awards will be notified by the Association by the end of May 2023. Funds will be sent to the scholastic institutions within five weeks of the start of the school year. All applicants will receive notification via letter by mid-June of the scholarship year.

Eligibility (*please note this important criteria*)

All Direct members in good standing with the Pacific Northwest Grain & Feed Association:

- 1. Immediate family members of a Direct member. *Direct Members: This category includes the country grain elevator companies, feed and flour milling operations and export grain merchandising firms throughout the Pacific Northwest. Direct members are assessed annual membership dues based on the company's annual gross annual sales volume. A list of current members is listed on the website.
- 2. Employee and/or a legal dependent of a Direct Member.
- 3. Owner/Patrons (farmers/members), or their legal dependents, of a Direct Member firm. A list of current Direct Members is listed on the website please take the time to verify a PNWGFA Direct Member.
- 4. All candidates must have received a letter of acceptance or be enrolled in an accredited college, university or community college. Consideration will be given to, but not limited to students who have chosen a career in some area of agriculture, business, home economics or vocational education.
- 5. Applicants may only be awarded a PNWGFA Scholarship once; previous winners not eligible again.

Application Procedure:

The following must be submitted by April 6, 2023:

- 1. Complete Scholarship Application (including all required statement pieces).
- 2. *A letter of introduction and recommendation from a <u>PNWGFA Direct Member</u> in good standing.

Selection Process:

- 1. The scholarship recipients are selected on the basis of academic record, potential to succeed, demonstrated leadership, extracurricular accomplishments, work experience and an evaluation by a counselor or advisor.
- 2. All recipients must enter school no later than the fall term following the announcement of the scholarship.
